The Autumn 2006 meeting of Siouxland Redwingers Chapter of the Red Wing Collectors Society was held at 1 p.m. on **Saturday, October 14, 2006** at the Pizza Ranch in Tea, South Dakota. 23 adults, 7 children, and 1 guest were present.

### OLD BUSINESS:

MINUTES from the July 2006 meeting were printed in the Newsletter.

**TREASURERS REPORT:** Michelle Heiberger gave the Treasurer's Report. Treasury Balance is \$3,940.64 with a few outstanding items: \$65 payment from the RWCS Auction for sale of the 2006 commemorative was given to Michelle today. Newsletter expenses are outstanding.

**QUILT BLOCK:** Each chapter was asked to make one quilt block for a quilt that will be raffled or auctioned during the 2007 Convention with proceeds to benefit the RWCS Foundation. Ruth Beall prepared a few samples, some with images of Mount Rushmore, another with a pheasant. Members present voted to send one of the Mount Rushmore blocks. Ruth is thanked for preparing the quilt block for Siouxland Redwingers' donation to the quilt.

**COMMEMORATIVE AUCTION:** Howard Swenson's \$85 bid won him a regular 2006 bean-pot commemorative. Casperson's \$260 bid won them the second 2006 special cobalt blue bean-pot commemorative. Howard Swenson's \$50 bid won him the 2006 RWCS Round-Up Teapot commemorative; this RWCS commemorative order was the final production piece made by Western Stoneware.

## PIONEER (AND OTHER INTERESTING) RECIPES

### Raspberry Barbecue Wings

From Taste of Home Annual Recipes cookbook, 2004

2/3 Cup barbecue sauce  
 2.3 cup seedless raspberry jam  
 3 tablespoons finely chopped onion  
 1 to 2 jalapeños, seeded and finely chopped  
 2 teaspoons minced garlic, divided  
 2 teaspoons liquid smoke (Optional)  
 Divided  
 ¼ teaspoon salt  
 15 whole chicken wings (about 3 lbs)\*\*  
 1 small onion, sliced  
 1 cup water

In a bowl, combine the barbecue sauce, jam, onion, jalapeños, 1 teaspoon of garlic, 1 teaspoon of liquid smoke, if desired, and salt. Mix well. Cover and refrigerate for 2 hours.

Cut wings into three sections; discard tip section. Place wings in greased 15 x 10 x 1 inch baking pan. Top with the sliced onion and remaining garlic. Combine the water and remaining liquid smoke (if desired). Pour over wings. Cover and bake at 350° for 30 minute or until juices run clear.

Transfer wings to a greased broiler pan; brush with sauce. Broil 4-6 inches from the heat for 20-25 minutes. Turn and baste every five minutes or until wings are well coated with first mixture.

Yield: 10-12 servings.

\*\*3 pounds of uncooked chicken wing sections (wingettes) may be substituted for the whole chicken wings. Omit cutting wings and discarding tips.

## Lincoln Museum Trip

After many years of trying to organize a trip we finally did it! 25-30 Siouxlanders and guests took a trip to the Schleich Red Wing Pottery Museum in Lincoln, Nebraska on November 4, 2006.

As many of you know, the museum is houses a great deal of the collection of Louise Schleich and the late Gerald (Jerry) and Schleich of Lincoln. The museum has wonderful displays for any Red Wing, pottery, or history enthusiast. There is stoneware, from salt glaze to the end of stoneware production, as well as pieces from every dinnerware pattern, and a very large collection of Red Wing art pottery and RumRill pottery, marking every major line produced.

There are many rare and unusual pieces at the museum, the most famous is probably the 70 gallon jug made for the 1923 Minnesota State Fair. Only three jugs of this size were made, and the only known survivor is housed in the museum.

Truly the only way to experience the museum is to visit it yourself! Even if you have already had the chance to see the museum, many displays are changed and rotated throughout the year.
